

Political Prisoner Dr. Richard I. Fine was held without bail and without trial.

There is no question that I am a political prisoner. You have an abusive power exercised by judges who have taken over the system, and I am the person who called them on it. You have the county supervisors (commissioners) taking public tax money and paying off the judges. In return the judges decide the cases in favor of the county. The next thing that you have is the State Legislature going in and giving the judges and the county supervisors immunity for their actions. At the same time you have the judges going to the State Bar to get me disbarred for the case I brought, that says the people have been denied due process. This is a pure political thing and the biggest judicial bribery scheme in the history of America. My being in jail for one year and possibly longer should show you that nobody is immune from this abuse of power.

If you go back and read the end part of the Declaration of Independence it talks about the judges being bought out by the King. In the beginning America did not have a judicial system. It was all being run by the King and that is why there was a rebellion. What is happening here in the US right now with my sitting here in this jail in this orange outfit means that the government is being run without obedience to the rule of law and with the loss of our judiciary, and that is the same thing that is happening in Iran, where people are thrown in jail for protesting about elections. It's happening in Myanmar.

Alex Jones: The sheriff won't say why he is in jail and he's just to sit there in jail forever. The Supreme Court is having an emergency hearing on it this week. Fine never got charged, there was no trial, there was no conviction to keep him there and the Sheriff, Leroy Baca, says he doesn't know why Fine is in jail, but he keeps him there, and has failed to answer Fine's writ of Habeas Corpus. Judicial Watch has filed on behalf of Fine. Out of the blue, Sheriff Baca changed his mind, and granted a filmed interview with Fine.

Fine: Look at the LA Times description of the repressive government and people who have not voted in 30 years. It's happening in Afghanistan and in Iraq. You vote the bums out and that is what it comes down to.

Alex Jones: How do you think the IRS courts work? Unelected criminal courts that take people's property without due process. How do you think the environmental courts work? They are taking people's farms and ranches without due process. How do you think CPS (child protective services) operates? There are no juries. They didn't have them till about 95 years ago. England about 100 years ago set up 'racial hygiene' family courts to sterilize people—eugenics. The US adopted it and financed Germany with the Kaiser Wilhelm institution, and permitted Adolph Hitler to do what he did. Family courts are part of the Health Department and are a Eugenics Guild to mop up and go after society. It's not due process. In Philadelphia kids were swept up by police and given long sentences in a juvenile prison that was giving 2.6 million dollars to two different judges. This was a pay-off for kidnapping the kids.
